Firearm Safety Course 10618NAT Enrolment Guide

1. Introduction:

The course deals with knowledge needed to use firearms safely, responsibly and legally. It forms a basic introduction to the firearms industry, covering the essential knowledge, skills and attitudes applicable to firearms legislation, firearms in the community, licensing requirements, safe handling, safe storage and transport, as well as additional information which is essential to all shooters. This course covers Category A, B and H firearms as these are the most common firearms used for sports/target, recreational and occupational shooting activities. Other courses are available on request.

On successful completion of this course, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for 10618NAT Course in Firearms Safety (Approved for Firearms Licensing in Queensland) in accordance with the training requirements to apply for a QLD Weapons Licence for categories A B and/or H. Included in the course is the technology of firearms and ammunition, safe handling and safe use of firearms, legal and social responsibilities of shooters, and practical shooting.

Category A firearms include air-rifles, single-barrelled and double-barrelled shotguns, and single-shot and repeating rim-fire rifles. Single-shot and repeating centre-fire rifles, double-barrelled centre-fire rifles, rifle-shotgun combinations, and muzzle-loading rifles are examples of Category B firearms. Category H is for handguns, strong use and storage conditions apply.

2. Benefits of SSAA Membership:

- Queensland Police accept SSAA Membership as a genuine reason to hold a Firearm Licence Category AB or H.
- Every SSAA Member is covered by the Association's \$20,000,000 public liability insurance policy this is printed on the Membership Card. This cover may help negotiate permission to hunt on a property.
- Most SSAA ranges offer discounted range fees to members.
- SSAA branches help members develop shooting skills over a variety of disciplines, and are a source of information about firearm selection, firearm maintenance and tuning, selection of ammunition, hand-loading, and hunting opportunities.
- SSAA members receive eleven (11) issues of 'Australian Shooter' magazine each year, posted. The monthly magazine, the saving on range fees, the gold insurance cover, and the help and advice from fellow members makes SSAA membership good value for money.

3. When and Where Courses are Held:

Courses are generally held on the **fourth Saturday of the month.** Please check the On-line booking for available dates. The starting time is 8:00 a.m., and the finishing time is approximately 4:00 p.m.

Please arrive by 7:45am for an 8.00am start.

5. What to Bring on the Day of Your Course

- 1. <u>Photo ID</u> is **ESSENTIAL** (*ONE* of e.g. Driver Licence, Passport, Over 18 Card, or Student Card) All SSAA membership letters and cards including pensioner cards etc. need to be viewed on the day. Please bring along all documents as evidence of membership and concessions.
- 2. All <u>juniors must have photo</u> **ID**; eg: Student Card, Drivers Licence, Proof of Age card, passport or passport photo (with name and DoB which must be signed by a JP). Juniors may be accompanied by an adult all-day, seating permitting.
- 3. USI number (Required for Course).

- 4. <u>Course Payment confirmation</u>, the printed ticket will be required.
- 5. BYO something to eat and drink we provide bottomless cold water.
- 6. **ENCLOSED FOOTWEAR** <u>must</u> be worn during Practical Shooting (thongs or sandals are not acceptable; no exceptions will be made.)
- 7. **HEARING PROTECTION** <u>must</u> be worn during Practical Shooting –. Bring your own, or we provide disposable ear plugs.
- 8. **EYE PROTECTION** <u>must</u> be worn during Practical Shooting your own safety glasses, prescription spectacles, or sunglasses may be adequate we provide safety eye protection.
- 9. Mobile phones <u>must</u> be turned off this will be explained on the day.
- 10. If you wish to take extensive notes, bring along a notebook we do not provide note paper.

6. How to Enrol:

Enrollment is through the online booking agency **Trybooking.com**. If more than one module is required to be booked (e.g. A/B + H) select A/B + (X) Extra Module, please book **ONE** ticket per person only.
